noun (accusative) + BOLET + **noun** (nominative)

Dceru bolí ucho. Kamaráda bolí záda. Evu bolí koleno.

Asking about Pain

Bolí vás něco? Co vás bolí? Does anything hurt you? What hurts you?

Kde vás (to) bolí? Where does it hurt?

Jak dlouho vás to bolí? How long have you had the pain? How long have you had a headache?

Kdy vás to bolí?When does it hurt?Jak často vás to bolí?How often does it hurt?Bolí vás to pořád?Does it hurt all the time?

Jaká je ta bolest (silná, ostrá)? What is the pain like (severe, sharp)?

zdraví (n) – health

nemoc (f) – illness, disease

cítit se – to feel

rýma (f) – runny nose, common cold

kašlat (kašlu) – to cough

kašel (m) – cough zvracet – to vomit průjem (m) – diarrhoea zácpa (f) – constipation

Jak se cítíte? How are you feeling? How do you feel?

Máte nějaké potíže? Do you have any health problems?

Máte teplotu? Do you have a temperature?

Jste nachlazený? Do you have a cold?

Máte rýmu? Do you have a runny nose?

Kašlete? Do you cough? Zvracíte? Do you vomit?

Máte průjem nebo zácpu? Do you have a diarrhoea or constipation?
